### E-Bikes in Medina Parks

Spring is upon us, and the nicer weather encourages all of us to get outside and enjoy it! We have seen a dramatic increase in the popularity and presence of electronic bikes (e-bikes) in and around our communities, and they are especially prevalent amongst the younger community members.

E-Bikes

Allowed in Medina Parks

Although the e-bikes provide a greater range with less effort than a standard bicycle, they can cause more damage to the grass landscaping in our parks due to their increased tire width and greater weight. E-bikes are not allowed in any of Medina's parks.

E-bikes are an outstanding way to visit our neighborhood parks, but they must be parked in designated bicycle parking stalls and kept off the grass areas. At Medina Beach Park, a bicycle rack has been installed at the top of the City Hall driveway where your bicycle can be locked and stored while you visit the park.

The Medina Police Department would also like to remind everyone traveling in and around our communities by e-bike to follow the rules of the road and ride with safety in mind at all times. Motorists should also remember to look out for e-bikes and be cognizant of their increased speed capabilities and potentially slower stopping capabilities. In our communities, we want to ensure our traffic-related incidents remain low and against the trend of increasing traffic-related injuries being seen throughout Washington State.

## City of Medina 2024 Comprehensive Plan Update

Medina City Council, Planning Commission, Development Services Committee, Park Board, Staff and Consultants are working toward having a complete draft of the updated Comprehensive Plan, including its elements, available for public review and comment by June 2024. This streamlined process should provide enough time, in Summer 2024, for the mandatory regulatory reviews (by the Puget Sound Region Council, and the 60-day notice to the Department of Commerce) to occur. In addition, State Environmental Protection Act (SEPA) review will be done, with a period of public input. While the public will have ample opportunity to view and comment on the entire document this Summer, community members have the chance to attend, either via Zoom or in person, the publicly noticed meetings of both the Medina City Council (the second and fourth Mondays of the month at 5:00 pm) and the Planning Commission (the fourth Tuesday of the month at 6:00 pm; other dates as publicly noticed) that are occurring this Spring, when the Comp Plan elements will be reviewed.

These efforts should result in the City reaching its goal of completing the Comp Plan by the mandatory December 31, 2024 deadline. After the preliminary document returns from PSRC and Commerce review in late Summer, it is set to be discussed further at a public hearing during the Monday, September 9, 2024, Medina City Council Meeting. Final review and adoption of the Comp Plan Update is tentatively scheduled for the Monday, October 14, 2024, City Council Meeting. All documents related to Comp Plan Updates discussed so far can be found on the City of Medina website at https://www.medina-wa.gov/meetings.
